WIND PHONE – Kaze no Denwa



The wind phone 風の電話, (kaze no denwa) is an unconnected telephone booth in Ōtsuchi, Iwate Prefecture, Japan, where visitors can hold one-way conversations with deceased loved ones. Initially created by garden designer Itaru Sasaki in 2010 to help him cope with his cousin's death, it was opened to the public in the following year after the 2011 Tohoku earthquake and tsunami killed over 15,000 people in the Tohoku region. The wind phone has since received over 30,000 visitors.



250+ replicas have been constructed around the world, and it has served as the inspiration for several novels and films.
